After AZ passed universal eligibility for ESAs, **71% of new students using universal vouchers** were already enrolled in private schools.

A school vouchers program in Colorado could cost between \$640 and \$790 million. Taxpayers funding private schools would sabotage all the progress Colorado has made toward funding public schools at our voter-approved constitutional minimum.
